June 2023 <u>"Come Away...and Rest a While"</u>

<u>"The apostles gathered together with Jesus</u>; and they reported to Him all that they had done and taught. And He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a secluded place and rest a while." (For there were many *people* coming and going, and they did not even have time to eat.) They went away in the boat to a secluded place by themselves."

BUT

"The people saw them going, and many recognized *them* and ran there together on foot from all the cities and got there ahead of them. When Jesus went ashore, He saw a large crowd, and He felt compassion for them because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and He began to teach them many things." (Mark 6:31-34)

<u>God's word tells us to take times of rest</u>. The Father rested, the Son rested, and we are told to take time off for our bodies, minds, and spirits to refresh. I frequently hear pastors and missionaries share about their fatigue, and even sickness, due to overwork. As a young worker for Jesus, I remember a pastor telling me that he, "would rather burn out than rust out", and I began to adopt that mindset (I'm afraid I may still err in that direction). However, looking back over 54 years of ministry, I have to say that neither of those extremes are biblical. We certainly don't want to be "lazy servants" of our Lord. On the other hand, our Lord told His disciples to "come away and rest".

<u>Yes</u>, there are times when our plans for respite are interrupted as Jesus' were, still, His directions to take rest are true and necessary. Please encourage your pastor to take regular as well as extended periods of rest. He will serve the Lord, his family, and you, more effectively. Please pray that Melva and I will know how and when to do so as well.

<u>May was a wonderful month of ministry</u> as we spent more time at home in Gunnison, holding our Saturday Night services, teaching a systematic theology class, and visiting shut-in saints.
