<u>September Happenings:</u> On September 6, I had my second knee surgery in a month, this time a total knee replacement. Obviously, that has slowed me a bit. Yet, after 2 weeks I was able to start leading our Saturday Night Worship Services and preach in Pitkin CO (from a stool). September 30^{th,} I conducted a Celebration of Life. The services seem to have a wonderful presence of the Holy Spirit in them. Our God is strongest when we are at our weakest! "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9b) Melva has been such a blessing as my nurse, driver, and more! What a blessed man I am!

<u>Upcoming</u>: Because of the surgeries, we had to cancel our planned revival with Hebron Baptist in Mississippi which was a huge disappointment! We also had to postpone ministering In Cripple Creek and Livermore CO. We are hoping to still make trips their way later in October or early November. Locally, we are re-starting our West Elk Bible Institute class on systematic theology as well as continuing our Saturday Night Worship Services and a Celebration of Life this month.

<u>Testimony and Update on the knees</u>: My right knee has a long history. In High School I was riding a small motorbike home from a church meeting. A car came over a hill in my lane and I went through its windshield. The police told my mother I probably wouldn't live the night, but after 19 days in Denver's Swedish Hospital I was released. The Lord wasn't through with me yet! However, glass from the car's windshield went into my knee and cut ligaments, tendons, etc. which the doctors couldn't repair. The surgeon stated I would never ski again.

For over 50 years I've been able to teach skiing and fight forest fires on that knee. Finally, after multiple "cleanouts", cortisone shots, etc. failed to diminish the pain, I knew it was time to deal with it. After exams by several doctors, I concluded that the Lord was leading me to this surgeon at this time. Four weeks later, I am walking pretty well without a cane and the Physical Therapists feel I may be able to ski in time to teach and hold chapel services on the mountain. Praise the Lord! Your prayers are making a big difference!
